
Gratitude is essential...

The Generosity began nearly 75 years ago...

In 1949, a group of Lutherans in Rapid City began to invest their time and treasure to create Calvary Lutheran Church. They built a church home on Cottonwood Street, that met the spiritual needs of hundreds of individuals and families for decades. In the early 2000's, Calvary Lutheran Church committed to envisioning, funding and building a new, bigger building to better serve and support the spiritual growth and needs of a growing congregation. Being realistic but wanting to ensure the final church would be beautiful and meet the long-term needs of a diverse congregation, it was decided to fundraise and build in stages.

In 2007, with the Fellowship Hall complete, the first service was on October 27, 2007. Another round of fundraising generated the additional financial resources and commitments needed to build and furnish the sanctuary and complete the church as envisioned. The first service in the new sanctuary was June 20, 2009. In 2017, the mortgage was "burned" and Calvary's new church was complete and fully paid for, solely through the generosity and support of church members and friends.

Over these many decades Calvary Lutheran Church has been a spiritual home and a place of hope, celebration and renewal for many. Generous hearts have provided the material and human resources needed to support members of the church and community to live their best lives reflecting God's love for everyone.

The Generosity Continues...

As a congregation committed to meeting the spiritual, physical and other needs of current and future members, individuals and families continue to share their treasure.

- Recently many opened their wallets to support remodeling the fellowship hall to be more functional for more uses, the addition of gathering areas for coffee and conversation and enhanced work areas.
- Members and friends always support the varied and on-going fund-raisers held by the youth of the church.
 These funds are used to enhance the spiritual growth of these young people and ensure money is not a barrier to participation.
- Quilters within the church use their time and treasure to both raise funds and provide comfort and warmth to those who receive the quilts.
- Generous donors within the church recently funded new bibles for all the pews to provide the opportunity to follow scripture during services of any kind.
- Calvary opened its doors and hosted a concert to support the relocation of Ukrainian Refugees to the South Dakota and Rapid City communities. It was an uplifting evening of giving and reflects Calvary's commitment to community.
- Consistent donations of time and money are provided by church members whenever a need is identified. Many of these donations are never known to the broader church community but reflect quiet support by individuals.
- Ongoing Endowment donations continue to build a financial foundation and revenue stream to support the church and it's work now and into the future. Current earnings of nearly \$25,000 annually support current activities while the principal grows over time.
