Work Anniversary Milestone Moment

Whether a person has been employed for 5, 10, 20, or more years, it is good to take a moment to recognize a commitment to work and encourage continuation of a job well done. We work to earn a living so that we can provide a roof over our heads, have food on the table, and clothing to wear. Types of work vary greatly.

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. once said:

"If a man is called to be a street sweeper, he should sweep streets even as a Michelangelo painted, or Beethoven composed music, or Shakespeare wrote poetry. He should sweep streets so well that all the hosts of heaven and earth will pause to say, 'Here lived a great street sweeper who did his job well.'"

Appreciating and understanding a person's work and contributions is key to showing that the work done has been valuable and contributes to society. Being grateful for the years worked and recognizing this gives a person a feeling of worth, satisfaction, and achievement. Acknowledging God's presence at this moment is affirming and provides the opportunity to engage in faith-filled conversations.

This Work Anniversary Milestone Moment provides an opportunity for family and friends to gather for a special time together. Recognizing special milestones in our lives provides an opportunity for people to grow in their faith together.

Naming – Recognizing the number of years that someone has been employed is a time to celebrate the commitment and work that has been accomplished.

Equipping – Talking about the history of the work over the years, including the mountain highs and valley lows is important. Use the Four Key Faith Practices to reflect on God's presence and how the person has lived out his or her faith through their work.

Blessing – Offering a blessing to the one who has achieved a work milestone provides a thoughtful time for all as they celebrate this special accomplishment.

Gifting – Giving a tangible gift or some other reminder of this occasion helps this moment be remembered for years to come.

Reinforcing – Reflecting on the recognition of a work anniversary and talking about changes and new or growing opportunities is a valuable way to follow-up in the future.

A follow-up for the Work
Anniversary Milestone Moment can
be done with caring conversations to
discuss the difference this work
makes in one's life. It is good to talk
about the significance of how
gaining new knowledge, skills, and
abilities can grow a person and
generate new opportunities. Gather
together as a group to pray and
reflect upon God's presence in our
lives and in what ways God is
always with us in all our endeavors.

An important step after experiencing the Four Key Faith Practices in a small group or home setting is to bless and equip friends and families by using faith practices daily as an intentional step to encourage faith traditions in the home.
